Petition filed- Widen pavement on Willow St. between Ninth street and Tenth street.





Resolution -In re State Highways.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OTTAWA, Kansas

That our representatives and senator in the 1929 Kansas Legislature be hereby respectfully requested to support a bill to give the city a fair and just compensation for the streets built and maintained by the city and which are used as a part of the state highway system, such compensation to be paid the city out of the 60% apportionment of the gasoline and motor vehicle taxes apportioned to the county. We suggest \$2,000 per mile for improved, and \$500. per mile or fraction of a mile for unimproved state highway streets.

WHEREAS, there is an ever increasing demand for new services by cities and the meeting of new problems of

municipal administration and economy, and,

WHEREAS, The statutes relating to cities have not been revised to make proper provisions for meeting these demands,

Therefore, we respectfully request our representatives and senator in the 1929 Legislature to support a bill which will authorize the governon to appoint a municipal code revision commission to revise, clarify and modernize our state statutes relating to cities and that a proper appropriation be made to pay for such work.

Remonstrance- improve Willow Street.



Report filed- by Engrs- Black and Veatch
Sewage Disposal Plant.

Black and Veatch, engineers employeed by the city for planning a sewage disposal plant for the city, submitted a supplemental report to their report submitted in January 1922, for sewage disposal in Ottawa.

This report was read and discussed, but no action taken on the recommendations submitted as it is the desire of the commission to give the report and recommendations further study.

Resolution- Bonds for rebuilding City Market.

Whereas, the city of Ottawa in Franklin County, Kansas is now the owner of and in control of a market square in said city which is maintained for the use and benefit of the people of said city, and

Whereas, during a recent flood the improvements thereon have been lost or damaged, and

Whereas, the mayor and commissioners of said city deem it necessary for the best interest of said city and for the use and benefit of the people thereof to restore and improve said market square, now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the mayor and commissioners of said city of Ottawa, Franklin County, Kansas that it proceed to restore and improve said market square as soon as funds are available for that purpose by restoring and improving said market square north of the alley for the use and benefit of the people of said city and that the money deemed necessary for such restoration and improvement shall be provided for by the issuance of \$5000. of bonds of said city as provided by law, said \$5000. being the amount the said mayor and commissioners deem necessary for said purpose, and by improving said market square south of said alley by building a sales pavillion and otherwise improving same for the use and benefit of the people of said city and that the money deemed necessary for building said sales pavillion and otherwise improvind said market square south of said alley shall be provided for by the issuance of \$10,000. of bonds of said city as provided by law, said \$10,000. being the amount the said mayor and commissioners deem necessary for said purpose. Said bonds to mature in equal amount for a period of ten years and to draw interest at the rate of 4% per cent per annum payable semi-annually on the date of said bonds and that the purpose to issue such bonds shall be submitted separately on such proposals to the voters of said city at the next general city election of said city to be held on the 2nd day of April A. D. 1929.

The foregoing resolution was duly passed by the governing body of the city of Ottawa, Kansas on the 27th day of February 1929, A.D.







The price of the gas to be 25¢ per m. cubic feet for the first 2,000,000 cubic feet per month, 22¢ per m. for the next 4,000,000 cubic feet per month, 20¢ per m. for the next 5,000,000 cubic feet per month, and 18¢ per m. for the balance of each monthly consumption. The foregoing proposition was accepted in preference to a rate of 25¢ per m. for the first 2,000,000 cubic feet per month and 20¢ per m. for the balance of each monthly delivery.

The following provision is also to be made a part of this contract:

"If during any monthly billing period Vendee fails to receive its entire industrial gas fuel requirements on account of inability of Vendor to deliver same, the number of days service was actually rendered shall be computed as a percentage applied to each of the blocks of the rate herein."







Supported by the opinion of the Attorney General and the statutes and ordinance governing this appointment, a copy of which is hereto attached.

Dear Mayor Ross:

I have yours of the 3rd inst. containing the following statement and inquiry:

" The city of Ottawa voted in the commission form of government in 1913 on the 17th day of April, 1913. The Mayor and commissioners organized and appointed the chief of police and other city officers for such city. These appointments were made regularly every two years until April, 1926, when the then serving chief of police and other officers resigned. Upon their resignation the mayor and commissioners appointed a chief of police, who served until April, 1928. At an April, 1928, meeting of the mayor and commissioners the same chief of police was reappointed and the records show that the appointment was intended for two years. The question now is: Did the term of this acting chief of police expire April 17, 1929? or in other words, was his appointment made in 1928 made to fill the vacancy and hence would expire April, 1929?

You request my opinion in regard to this matter.

In answer to your inquiry will say that, under the

above statement, the term of the chief of police of the city of Ottawa began in April 1913, and lasted for two years thereafter (R.S. 14-1501). The two year term of the chief of police in that city thereafter commenced in April of each odd numbered year and a term of such officer should begin in April 1929. When the chief resigned in April 1926, and another person was appointed to fill the vacancy in said office such person could only be appointed to serve for the remainder of the term for which his successor was appointed or until April 1927 (RS.14-1501). A chief of police should have been appointed in April 1927, whose term would expire in April 1929. But this was not done and the person appointed to that office in April 1926, served until April 1928, when he was appointed again for a period of two years.

The term of the chief of police who was appointed in April 1926, expired in April, 1927, and he was only a defacto officer from April 1927, to April 1928. When he was appointed in April 1928, he could only be appointed until April 1929, because the regular term of the chief of police in the city of Ottawa ended at that time. The term of the present chief of police, therefore, expired in April 1929, and the board of commissioners now has authority to appoint a new chief of police for a term of two years beginning with April 1929. The case of Hale vs Bischoff, 53 Kan. 301, tends to support this view.

4. This procedure is due the appointee, the public, and all the members of the commission as a matter of fairness and justice to all.
5. A simple declaration by the commission that an office is vacated without giving the officer a fair hearing would doubtless be an act of malfeasance in office that would be sufficient ground for recall.



Second Order- State Board of Health
In re Sewage Disposal Plant.

The State Board of Health filed with the city an order for the city to construct and maintain a Sewage Disposal Plant. The order is as follows:

Whereas, the State Board of Health formally adopted resolutions on June 30, 1927, ordering the city of Ottawa to construct a sewage treatment works, and

Whereas, the legislature of 1929 in Chapter III of the Session Laws of 1929 made certain modifications of the law authorizing cities to construct sewage disposal works,

Therefore, be it resolved that the State Board of Health does hereby reconsider the existing order and does hereby reissue the same with such modifications as are necessary to make the order conform to the above statute and with the further change of time of completion date from July 1st, 1929, to January 1, 1930, the revised order to read as follows:

Whereas, the City of Ottawa is discharging untreated sewage into the Marais Des Cygnes River, such discharge having been the cause of complaints to the State Board of Health, which complaints have been found to be just and real, upon inspection by representatives of the Board, and

Whereas, the Marais des Cygnes river is the source of the Domestic water supply of Osawatomie, which source should be in the interests of public health, be protected from all unnecessary pollution, and

Whereas, the city officials or their authorized representatives have been cited to appear before this Board and to show cause, if any, why an order should not be issued requiring sewage treatment.

Therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in the State Board of Health under Chapter 65, Article 164, Revised Statutes of 1923, and Chapter 239, Session Laws of 1927, the State Board of Health finds that a public nuisance exists caused by the lack of proper disposal works and the resulting discharge of untreated sewage by the City of Ottawa into the waters of the Marais des Cygnes River and that such waters are being polluted in a manner prejudicial to the health of the citizens of the state and detrimental to the aquatic life of the state, and it is hereby ordered

that the city of Ottawa construct such sewage treatment works as may be necessary to abate the conditions of stream pollution created by the discharge of untreated sewage; the plans and specifications for this work to be submitted to the Board of Health for approval on or before July 1, 1929, and that the treatment works be completed and in operation by January 1, 1930.

Protest- paving
South Hickory street- Insufficient.

City Attorney Pleasant reports as follows
on the remonstrance on paving South Hickory street.

To the Honorable Mayor and Commissioners

Gentlemen:

" I have examined the remonstrance to the proposed resurfacing of South Hickory street between the south line of Ninth street and Twelfth street. I find from the remonstrance that the owners of 83 lots that would be affected by this resurfacing are opposed to it. This leaves 61 lots not represented on the remonstrance. The total number of lots that would be chargeable to cost is 144."

Based on the findings of the City Attorney, the remonstrance was declared sufficient to defeat the resurfacing of this street at this time.

Order for condemnation of Land.
Sewage Disposal Plant Site.

Whereas the city of Ottawa, Franklin County, Kansas has for many years caused the sewage of said city to be discharged into the Marais des Cygnes river, and
Whereas the discharge of such sewage into said river is causing and has caused the existance of a public nuisance by the lack of the said city's having sewage disposal works and is generally a menace to the health of the city and the inhabitants of Franklin County, Kansas living down the said river from the said city, and

Whereas the State Board of Health of the State of Kansas has, by written order of said board, ordered and directed that the said city of Ottawa proceed to the establishment and construction and permanent maintenance of a system of sewage disposal works, and

Whereas it becomes necessary to condemn certain real estate for the purpose of using the same for a site and location on which to build and erect and permanently maintain sewage disposal works and to permanently condemn right-of-way and easement over other tracts and parcels of ground for the further purpose of furnishing a right-of-way to be used for the purpose of extending a main sewage system in said city, from a main sewer line as now established to the said proposed site and place where the said sewage disposal works are to be located.

Now, therefore the governing body of said city of Ottawa, Franklin County, Kansas deems it necessary to condemn and permanently appropriate private property for the purpose herein before mentioned, and the said governing body having caused a survey and description of the land and easement so required to be made by a competent engineer and filed with the city clerk of said city.

It is therefore ordered by said governing body that the following described real estate be and the same hereby is condemned for the purpose of providing a system of disposal works for the purification of the sewage of the said city of Ottawa and for the purpose of building, operating and maintaining perpetually such disposal works and the said governing body hereby orders that for the purpose herein mentioned, the following real estate be and the same hereby is condemned as provided by law.

All that portion of the north-east quarter of section thirty six in township sixteen of range nineteen Franklin County, Kansas which lies south and west of the Marais des Cygnes river, bounded on the west by the west line of the Northeast quarter of said section thirty six, township sixteen of range nineteen, on the south by the north line of the south-east quarter of said section thirty six, township sixteen, range nineteen and on the north and east by the Marais des Cygnes river and subject to the Missouri Pacific right-of-way and easement and that a permanent right-of-way be permanently condemned through and over the following described tracts and parcels of ground for sewer purposes:

Beginning on the north line of Cloud Addition to the said City of Ottawa, Franklin County, Kansas at a point thirty seven and one half feet west of the intersection of the said north line with the right-of-way of the Missouri Pacific Railway Company. Thence in a south-easterly direction parallel to said right-of-way to the west line of lot forty one in block two of Cloud Addition to said city, thence south to the north line of Third street in said city, thence east to the right-of-way of the Missouri Pacific Railway Company, thence in a north-westerly direction along said right-of-way to the north line of said Cloud Addition to said city, thence west thirty seven and one half feet to the place of beginning except that portion of the above described tract included in the alley.

Also beginning at the intersection of the south line of the northeast quarter of Section thirty six, township sixteen of range nineteen in Franklin County, Kansas with the west line of the right-of-way of the Missouri Pacific Railway Company, thence in a north-easterly direction at an angle of forty degrees with said south line of the said northeast quarter to the east line of said right-of-way twenty feet, thence in a south-westerly direction parallel with the course first designated to the west line of said railway right-of-way, thence in a north-westerly direction along said right-of-way to the place of beginning.

M. L. Staneart, \$584.60 with \$2.50 additional per cubic yard for loose or shell rock and \$7.00 for solid rock requiring blasting.
Anderson Plumbing & Heating Co, \$713. with \$2.50 for each cubic yard of loose or shell rock and \$7.50 additional for solid rock requiring blasting.
Elder Mercantile Co, \$671.50 with \$2.50 for each cubic yard of loose or shell rock and \$8.00 for solid rock requiring blasting.
Engineers estimate \$725.00

The proposal of M. L. Staneart being the lowest bid received and being below the estimate of the engineer, it was determined that he should be given the contract and the Mayor and the City Clerk were instructed to enter into contract with him ten days after the passage of the ordinance providing for this work.


The City Governing Body met in Adjourned session with Mayor Ross presiding, Commissioners Mitchell and Johnson present.
