
Ordinance: First Reading: Transient Merchants.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 6th, 1935 were inspected and duly approved.

Resolution: In Re, Special Illumination of S. Main st from 5th to 13th streets.

Whereas a petition is being circulated among resident property owners on South Main Street, in the City of Ottawa, Kansas, praying for the special illumination of said street from Fifth to Thirteenth Streets,

And Whereas the City of Ottawa, Kansas, is the owner of the property fronting and abutting upon said street between Fifth and Park Streets, the same being known as the east half of College Park,

And Whereas, the governing body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, is of the opinion that said street should be specially illuminated and that an additional system of lights is necessary for that purpose and that such illumination thereof will be conducive to the public convenience and welfare,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by The Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, that South Main Street in the City of Ottawa, Kansas, from Fifth to Thirteenth Streets should be specially illuminated and that an additional system of lights is necessary for that purpose and that such illumination thereof will be conducive to the public convenience and welfare, and that the City of Ottawa, Kansas, as the owner of the property fronting and abutting upon South Main Street in said city from Fifth to Park Streets, should sign said petition praying for the special illumination of South Main Street in said city from Fifth to Thirteenth streets, which said petition specifies that the number of lights shall be not to exceed seven in each block, and the Mayor and City Clerk of said city are hereby authorized and directed to execute such petition for and on behalf of the City of Ottawa, Kansas.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted by a unanimous vote of the City Governing Body.

Petition: Enlargement of Boundaries of City of Ottawa

To the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County Kansas:

The City of Ottawa, Kansas, desires to enlarge the limits thereof, from territory adjacent thereto, and the Governing Body of said city herewith respectfully petitions your Honorable Body to add the following described territory to said city, to-wit:

Commencing at the point of intersection of south line of Section Two (2), Township Seventeen (17), Range Nineteen (19), Franklin County, Kansas with the East line of the right-of-way of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railroad Company, thence south along the east line of said railroad right-of-way to a point One Hundred Fifty (150) feet south of the south line of the State Highway known and designated as K-33, thence east to the point of intersection of such line with the corporation line of said city from Thirteenth to Fifteenth streets produced, thence north to the south line of Section One (1), Township Seventeen (17), Range Nineteen (19), Franklin County, Kansas, thence west along the south line of said Sections One (1) and Two (2) to the place of beginning, and also

Commencing at the point of intersection of the south line of Shattuck's Addition to the City of Ottawa, Kansas with the east line of the right-of-way of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railroad Company, thence in a southwesterly direction along the east line of said right-of-way to the north corporation limits of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, thence east along said north corporation limits of said city to the west corporation limits of said city in the intersection of North Main and Wilson streets of said city, thence north along the west corporation limits of said city to the point of intersection with the north line of Dundee street in said city, thence north along the west line of Section Twenty-five (25), Township Sixteen (16), Range Nineteen (19), Franklin County, Kansas to the point of intersection of such line with the south line of Shattuck's Addition produced, thence west along the south line of said Shattuck's Add. to the point of beginning,


and respectfully asks your Honorable Body to make a finding, as expeditiously as the same may be done according to law, as to the advisability of adding said territory to said city.


Petition for Street Light: Pecan and 9th streets.


Public Hearing on Petition for Whiteway on Main from 5th to 13th.



House-Moving Permit & Bond: J. E. Barnum

The Governing Body, by a unanimous vote, authorized the City Clerk to issue a permit to J. E. Barnum for the moving of a house over and along the streets of Ottawa from 3rd and Cherry streets to Grant street of said City. Said J. E. Barnum having first paid the fee required and filed a surety bond in amount of \$ 500.00 covering the conditions of this permit, which bond was duly approved this day and on file in the office of the City Clerk.

Retail Bee Licenses:

Acting upon the applications of Jim Overholt and Lyle O Kirkland for license to sell beer at retail at 101 S. Main and 212 N. Main respectively, the Governing Body, by a unanimous vote, authorized the City Clerk to issue the licenses as applied for.

Resolution: In Re, White-way on Main, 5th to 13th

WHEREAS, On the 20th day of February 1935 there was filed in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, a petition signed by the resident owners of more than one-half of the feet owned by residents fronting and abutting upon Main street in said city from Fifth street to Thirteenth street, praying the Governing Body of said city to specially illuminate such portion of said street, and to construct, install, equip and maintain an additional system of lights for that purpose, and

WHEREAS, The Governing Body of said city did, on the 20th day of February 1935, fix the time and place of such hearing to be Wednesday, March 6, 1935 in the City Hall at 9 o'clock A. M. and caused the City Clerk to give notice thereof in the official city paper at least five days before the date fixed for said hearing, which was within twenty days from the filing of such petition, and

WHEREAS, The Governing Body of said city at the time and place for the hearing of such petition, fixed as aforesaid, found that notice had been given of the time and place fixed for such hearing as required by law and declared and found that fact, and directed the same to be entered upon the records of the City Clerk, and

WHEREAS, The Governing Body of said city thereupon gave opportunity for all persons in favor of or opposed to granting the prayer of such petition to be heard and to present all other evidence that they desired for the purpose of ascertaining whether such petition was signed by the proper number of persons possessing the qualifications prescribed by law and whether the statements of such petition are true, and

WHEREAS, Upon such hearing it was found that such petition is in conformity with the requirements of law and that the allegations thereof are true and that it is advisable and expedient to illuminate such portion of said street and that the cost thereof will not be burdensome upon the persons to be directly benefited, and decision to that effect is made, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
OTTAWA, KANSAS,

That the construction, installation, equipment and maintenance of such additional system of lights as may be required for that purpose, is necessary to be done, and that said Governing Body shall cause such additional system of lighting to be constructed, installed, equipped and maintained under the supervision of the City Engineer in accordance with the following general specifications, to-wit:

Single lamp ornamental lighting units on ornamental posts placed on each side of Main street, seven (7) to each block from Seventh street to Thirteenth st, and twelve similar lighting units from Fifth street to Seventh street. Said lighting fixtures, with a system of underground cable, shall be of a size suitable for operating twenty-five hundred (2500) lumen lamps to be installed now and capable of operating four thousand (4000) lumen lamps if desired at some future time.

The foregoing Resolution was duly adopted by a unanimous vote of the City Governing Body.

Dry Toilets: At 525 and 533 South Oak street.

Acting upon a complaint relative to the dry toilets at 525 and 533 S. Oak street the Governing Body instructed the City Clerk to address a letter to each of the property owners urging them to make connection with the sanitary sewer system thereby eliminating any cause for complaint. It being understood that this action is not a formal order to abate the alleged nuisance but rather a specific recommendation for the mutual good of all concerned.

Engineer's Estimate of Cost: South Main Whiteway
5th to 13th Streets

It is the desire of the Governing Body of this city that I inform you that they have decided to accept the proposition of the Federal Housing Administration for a property inventory to be made in the City of Ottawa, in line with the recommendations presented by Mr. Young and Mr. Neal in their recent conference here.

It being understood that, in the acceptance of this proposition, the City of Ottawa will not incur an expense in excess of \$ 300.00 in providing for office space, equipment and supplies necessary to carry out the project and that the Federal expenditure of approximately thirty five (\$3500.00) hundred dollars will be in addition to, and aside from the present allotments of relief appropriations by KERC in this county.

The city desires also to recommend that Roy W. Stookey of this city be appointed by you as the local director of the project.

Salaries & Wages of certain City Employees:

The City Governing Body, by a vote of two to one, duly fixed the salaries and wages of the following named city employees, the same to be effective as of May 1st, 1935. Commissioner of Finance and Revenue, H. E. Rodgers who was opposed to this action for the reason that the salaries and wages fixed represented an increase to a point approximately to that of the scale in effect in 1933 when the reductions were made. His objections being set forth on page 210 of the minute records.

In Re: Purchase of Land for lake on Appanoose Creek


For a number of months a group of citizens have been endeavoring to develop a project whereby a lake may be built in Franklin County with the idea of providing an adequate water supply for the City of Ottawa in addition to recreational, park and water conservation purposes. Their efforts have now progressed to a point where it is necessary to have some definite word from the City Governing Body relative to the position the city will take in the matter. In line with this need, the Governing Body has authorized the Mayor to address an open letter, to be placed in the hands of the men interested in the matter, setting forth the following, to-wit:

Highland Cemetery Permanent Reserve Fund: In Re, Sale of Adelaide Claypool Mortgage.

Acting upon the recommendation of H. E. Rodgers, Commissioner of Finance and Revenue, the City Governing Body authorized the sale of the \$ 1600.00 Claypool mortgage for the sum of \$ 1200.00. The proceeds from which sale to be credited to the Highland Cemetery Permanent Reserve Fund for re-investment as soon as satisfactory securities may be found.

This action, although resulting in a loss of \$ 400.00, was deemed advisable for the reason that the valuation of the mortgaged property had materially decreased since the purchase of the mortgage in 1925. The dwelling had been permitted to decay to a point where it probably should be torn down. The interest had not been paid since October 1931 and since the owner was unsuccessful in securing a loan from the Federal Home Owners Loan Corporation with which to discharge all indebtedness against the property there seemed to be nothing left to do but make a compromise settlement.

J. L. Elliott, recently appointed Police Officer of the City of Ottawa, resigned from such office effective as of August 7th, 1935. Acting upon the recommendation of Mayor Gibson, the resignation was duly accepted by the Governing Body.


The Mo. Valley Electrical Company had submitted no photographs or design drawings of the luminaire offered. The Glasco Electric Company had no representative present and had not stated the brand of cable offered. Mr. Bateman, representative of the Mo. Valley Electrical Company, stated that a sample of the "U.S." luminaire would be secured in about a week. The representative of the Columbian Electrical Company asked for permission to withdraw its bid before it was read, stating that an error had been made in the price, but this was not granted.

Temporary Notes Authorized: South Main Street Whiteway Construction Funds.

The City Governing Body duly authorized the issuance of two (2) temporary notes in amount of \$ 2500.00 each in order to provide funds with which to pay for the installation of a special illuminating system of lights on South Main street from 5th to 13th streets. Said notes to be dated January 1st, 1936, to bear interest at the rate of $\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum from date and payable on demand.

This action of the Governing Body being in accord with 10-123 Revised Statutes of Kansas, 1923 and represent two of a possible series of such notes of like tenor which may be issued from time to time for the purpose above defined which will not exceed in the aggregate the sum of \$ 7320.00, which amount being the engineer's estimate of cost of this improvement that was duly filed in the office of the City Clerk and duly approved by the City Governing Body.

Sale of Temporary Notes Authorized:
