Be It Further Resolved by the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, that the alleys in Blocks 59, 72 and 98 in said city be designated and signposted for one-way traffic, and that all traffic in said alleys shall be, and the same is, herewith limited and restricted to south-bound traffic, and that north-bound traffic in said alleys shall be, and the same is, herewith prohibited, and

Be It Further Resolved by the Governing Body of the City of Ottawa, Kansas, that the above alleys in said city so designated for one-way traffic as above set forth, shall be sign-posted showing the direction of the traffic permitted thereon.
