



Petition : Improve East 7th Street .


A petition bearing the names of three property owners asking for the improvement of East 7th street from Cherry to Burrough was read and examined. No action taken.





Janitor \$220.00 per month. Street Foreman \$345.00 per month and overtime for all over 40 hrs per week.
