Read the first time, considered by sections and placed upon its final passage, the question being shall the ordinance pass. The vote taken resulted in Ayes three and Nays none. The vote being unanimous for the said ordinance was declared duly passed.

Ordinance No. 2173: Second Reading

An ordinance vacating portions of Locust Street and Pontiac Street in the City of Ottawa, Kansas was introduced and placed upon its second and final reading, read the second time, considered by sections and placed upon its final passage. The question being shall the ordinance pass. The vote taken resulted in Ayes three and Nays none. The vote being unanimous for the said ordinance was declared duly passed.

Ordinance No. 2174: Second Reading

An ordinance creating lateral sewer district no. 132 in the City of Ottawa, Kansas, authorizing the construction of a lateral sewer therein and providing for the payment of the cost thereof was introduced and placed upon its second and final reading, read the second time, considered by sections and placed upon its final passage. The question being shall the ordinance pass, the vote taken resulted in Ayes three and Nays none. The vote being unanimous for the said ordinance was declared duly passed.

Bids Opened: Police Car & Fire Dept Car

Wage Increase: Members of Street Dept.


